Module 6: Comprehensive Geography

Module 6: Geography: This module will cover the complete syllabus of Geography for UPSC Prelims and mains along with relevant current affairs of Geography like recent volcanic eruptions, Earthquakes and terms in news like urban heat islands. This module has been divided into three blocks viz. Physical Geography, Indian Geography and World geography.
